


I think there are many meanings and interpertations to be made from this artwork, which is why i love it.



36 QUESTIONS TO FALL IN LOVE (ALLEGEDLY)



In 1997 the psychologist Arthur Aron conceived 36 questions devolved to make two strangers fall in love in 45 minutes. The experiment envisages two people (in Aron's case, a man and a woman) sitting in front of each other in an empty room, answering a series of questions that become increasingly more personal and intimate. The two strangers need to answer to all of them in 45 minutes, and then make silent eye contact for 4 minutes. In the publication of his findings, Arthur Aron called this experiment: "The Experimental Generation of Interpersonal Closeness".

Far-fetched? Maybe. However, in 2015, the academic and journalist Mandy Len Catron wrote an article in the New York Times recounting her own experience with Arthur Aron's experiment, and how – in her case – it had worked. After more than a decade from that first date, Mandy Len Catron and her partner are still together, they married, and had two children.

In the hope of having piqued your curiosity, here is the list of questions.

Der Kuss





The Eternal Three


There are two men in this world Who constantly cross my path One is the man I love The other one loves me.



MOVIE RECOMENDATIONS



The butterfly effect, Eric Bress, J. Mackye Gruber (2004)



The term 'Butterfly Effect' is a reference to a concept in chaos theory where small events can lead to large events in unpredictable ways. I think this movie represents that well.

From the beginning, we notice things happening, but it is only later in the movie that we understand what is going on. And I think that even if we find some parts confusing, this film is very good and the plot keeps you engaged until the end.

I think you should give it a chance!

And also, the movie has four different final scenes, so the lasting message of the movie may differ depending on the copy watched.

Anatomie d'une chute, Justine Triet (2023)



The movie does not really need a presentation. Not only it won of the Palme d'Or at the 2023 Cannes Film Festival, but it was also nominated for multiple Academy Awards, winning the Oscar for "Best Original Screenplay".

The plot follows the trial of a German woman (played masterfully by Sandra Hüller) who has been accused of murdering her French husband in France.

Under the guise of the true crime genre, this film showcases a cold and unforgiving autopsy of a marriage.

The masterful direction, the amazing acting performances, and the award-winning scrip, written by Justine Triet and Arthur Harari (who, interestingly, are a real life couple) will keep you glued to the screen, as the entire relationship between the accused murderer and the victim is vivisectioned by the jury.





Servings: 2 people (about 12 ravioli)
Preparation time: 30 minutes
Cooking time: 5-7 minutes

FOR THE PASTA

- 250g all-purpose flour
- ·1 egg
- ·A pinch of salt

FOR THE FILLING

- ·125 g ricotta
- ·100 g spinach
- •1/2 egg
- ·salt and pepper as you like

Recipe:

- Start mixing the flour, egg, salt, and olive oil (optional) to make the dough.
- Knead for about 10 minutes until smooth, then cover and let rest for 30 minutes.
- For the filling, cook and chop the spinach
- Roll out the dough, cut into heart shapes, and place a spoonful of filling in the center of each.
- Seal the edges by pressing them together, you can use a fork.
- Boil the ravioli in salted water for 3-4 minutes, or until they float to the surface, then drain.

Serve with melted butter and sage, or a simple tomato sauce.

Heart stitch Tutorial by hopefulhoney

Chain in multiples of 6 + 3 stitches your main colour of choice

Row 1: Skip 3 chains from your hook, 1 dc in the 4th chain. Crochet 1 dc in every chain stitch until you reach the end of row 1. At the end of the row chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 2: Ch1, 1 sc in same st. 1 sc in every st. Turn your work and change your yarn colour to whatever shade you would like your heart design to be.

Row 3: ch 2, turn your work. Crochet a cluster of 3 dc in the first crochet. Ch 2. Skip 5 stitches. Crochet your next cluster stitch of 3 dc. Ch 2. Crochet another cluster stitch in that same stitch to form your first heart.

Skip the next 5 stitches. Repeat. At the end of row 3, skip 5 stitches and crochet a cluster in the last stitch of the row, changing back to your main yarn colour. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 4: Chain 1 and turn your work. 1 sc in first stitch, ch 1, crochet 1 hdc in the 2nd skipped stitch 2 rows below and in the 3rd and 4th stitch, working over chain 2 section in the previous row.

Ch 2. 1 sc in the chain 2. Ch 2 and repeat step 6 working again over the next chain 2 section (working into the 2nd, 3rd and 4th skipped stitch). Chain 2. 1 sc in the chain two. Repeat until the end of row 4. Ch 1. Crochet 1 sc at the top of the cluster stitch.

Row 5: Ch 2, turn your work. 1 dc in chain 1 space. Work 1 dc in each of the next 3 stitches. Work 1 dc in the next chain stitch. 1 dc in the next sc space. And a dc in the chain 2 space. Repeat

Once you've reached the end of row 5, crochet 1 dc in that chain 1 space. 1 dc in the last stitch of the row. Repeat row 2-5 to continue your heart crochet stitch design.
